# Rotary FNQ Field Days returns bigger than ever

GET ready for Northern Australia's biggest display of agricultural excellence - an event that brings together the best of farming, innovation, and community spirit.

The vibrant showcase celebrates the heart of the region's agriculture, featuring cutting-edge technology, local businesses and interactive exhibits for all ages.

Businesses from across Queensland and interstate have jumped at the chance to take part in the biennial 2025 Rotary FNQ Field Days, which will be held at the Mareeba Rodeo Grounds on May 28, 29 and 30.

The three-day event has grown exponentially since its conception in the mid-1980s, with more than 16,000 people attending in 2023 and a record of more than 500 sites and 450 exhibitors.

This year's event promises to set the bar even higher, in a celebration of everything that makes Northern Australia's agricultural industry strong, sustainable and full of potential.

Hosted by the Rotary Clubs of Atherton and Mareeba, all funds raised are donated to charities and community organisations.

This year's key theme of Ag and Innovation has attracted peak national bodies, industry groups and representatives, who will deliver presentations and displays in an all-new

agriculture and innovation area.

Crowd-favourites will also be returning, such as the Tractor Pull and Garden Tractor Display, daily working machinery demonstrations, events in the arena, cattle display, Emergency Services display, market stalls, and much more.

Tablelands businesses Mete Motor Group, Tyrepower Mareeba, and NQ Agricultural Services have again thrown their support behind the hugely successful event, coming on board as the Strategic Partners.

Rotary FNQ Field Days event Chair Andrew McCosh encouraged members of the community to get behind the Field Days, in what promises to be the event's biggest and best to date.

"There are going to be some incredible showcases and demonstrations of new innovations and the latest products, plenty of food options and great general networking opportunities," he said.

"This event gives people an opportunity to come and see what's going on in the agricultural area and some of our locals are at the forefront of that innovation.

"I really enjoy going through the exhibits and looking at what they've got to offer, and how it's going to be used to improve the future.

"There are some extremely innovative people

on the Tablelands running things to improve a whole range of different processes with

"I'm pretty certain that most people will walk away with at least one or two things that they're going to use or maybe think about using in the future."

Mr McCosh praised the dedicated organising committee for all their efforts in planning and preparing for the 2025 event.

"We've got a very strong committee – everyone does their part and it all pulls together," he said.

"The committee members are all volunteers and it would be hundreds of hours of work that they have put in.

"I've also got to give credit to Site Co-Ordinator Nina Grant and Marketing Manager Jeanette Sturiale who are part of the glue that holds everything together for the whole event.

"The event simply would not go ahead with such people who are key."

Site co-ordinator Nina Grant said there were more than 500 sites and 450 exhibitors ready to showcase and demonstrate new innovations and the latest products.

'We are very happy with the interest we have and we're certain that we will sell out," she said.

"The Ag and Innovation area of this year's

event has taken it to yet another level. The interest has been incredible."

Online bookings are the preferred method for ticket sales, with a discounted rate available for pre-purchase tickets single day tickets - \$10 single day entry, \$25 for a three-day pass, and \$8 for Pensioner or Disability Concession Card

Once you've purchased your ticket, a link will be sent to your phone that you show upon entering the Rotary FNQ Field Days.

Tickets will still be available to purchase at the gate on the day - \$15 single day entry, \$30 for a three-day pass, and \$10 for Pensioner or **Disability Concession Card Holder.** 

Entry is free for children under 17, school students in uniform and teachers in company with group, and carer/support workers accompanying a person or group.

The 2025 Rotary FNQ Field Days will be open Wednesday, May 28 and Thursday, May 29 from 9.00am to 5.00pm, and Friday, May 30 from 9.00am to 3.00pm.

FROM humble beginnings on the Atherton Tablelands, the Rotary FNQ Field Days has grown into a premier agriculture event.

What started as a local initiative has flourished into a large-scale showcase of innovation, industry, and community spirit.

This year, the three-day event promises to be the biggest and best yet, proudly hosted by the Rotary Clubs of Atherton and Mareeba.

With more exhibitors, more attractions, and more opportunities to connect, 2025 is set to make a new chapter in the Field Days' remarkable journey.

The Mareeba Rodeo Grounds will be transformed into a village of agricultural excellence, showcasing the very best machinery, equipment, services, and products from all over the country.

Rotary FNQ Field Days Site Co-ordinator, Nina Grant said there had been strong demand from businesses and organisations from across Queensland and interstate wanting to take part

As a result, there will be more than 500 sites and 450 exhibitors to cater for the event's expediential growth.

"We are very happy with the interest we have had and there are still people wanting to book, but we're running out," Ms Grant said.

"We have many exhibitors that come back year after year to the Field Days because they do so well over the three days.

"So many businesses report great sales and great customer interaction as well as generating new interest from being out in the public.

"Due to this success, we have businesses that have never taken part in the Field Days and want to be involved and get their name out there. We've created more exhibitor sites to allow for this growth and it's something we're really excited about."

Rotary FNQ Field Days Event Chairman Andrew McCosh said it was great to see so many businesses returning to the event in 2025, and welcomed those who would be exhibiting for the first time.

"We have a very strong repeat customer base and many of them have been coming since the event first started," he said.

"The demand for sites has always been very

"We sell out 80 per cent of the sites within two weeks of them being released. Its highly competitive to get spots."

The Rotary FNQ Field Days is also known for



its work in giving back to the local community, with more than \$30,000 donated to various charities and organisations in 2023.

This is a result of the large number of volunteers who put their hand up to work and in exchange for a donation to their chosen charity or organisation.

Volunteer Co-ordinator Ida Portella said the event simply would not be possible without community members offering their time to

"For everyone that volunteers, we pay \$20 per hour volunteered to their preferred charity or not for profit organisation of choice," she

"In the past we paid \$15 per hour, but this year we've increased that as a way to really show our appreciation for their support."

A dedicated pickup and drop off service will also be on offer at the event to assist people that purchase larger items from exhibitors.

Ms Grant said volunteers would drive the

large items out to the gates throughout the day to assist patrons delivering the items to their

"This is going to be a new dedicated service to help people deliver the larger items that they have bought back to their vehicles," she said.

"There will be a direct phone number and exhibitors will ring to book in that service for the customer. People can also visit the Site Office on the day if they'd like more information."

## Major economic boost for region

THE Tablelands region is reaping the rewards of hosting Northern Australia's biggest display of agricultural excellence, with a significant surge of economic activity to the community.

The three-day Rotary FNQ Field Days transforms the area into a bustling hub, attracting more than 16,000 visitors and hundreds of businesses, and injecting valuable revenue into local tourism, hospitality and retail sectors.

From increased accommodation bookings to higher retail and hospitality spending, the biennial event not only showcases the region's key role in Australia's agricultural landscape, but also drives growth, jobs and long-term regional development.

Mareeba Chamber of Commerce President and Regional Development Australia Board Member, Joe Moro said the Field Days was one of the town's major events that injected millions of dollars into the local economy.

"From an economic point of view the Field Days, similar to the Mareeba Rodeo and Savannah in the Round, are huge economic boosts for the town and for the area," he said.

"There's a lot of work that's generated by the simple fact that the event happens"

"Savannah in the Round injects about \$30 million into the area – we don't have that economic data for the Field Days yet, but we'd industry groups, and key representatives probably get half that injected into the town.

"The big benefit is that more people will be driving through the CBD, some of them will stop and have a bite to eat or fuel up and spend a bit of money. Some people will also be staying in the motels - I'd imagine most would be booked solid leading up to the Field Days, and that's a statement you can make across the Tablelands as well.

"Even the Tablelands Regional Council area benefit from the event and even Cairns gets a bit of spin off because some people will drive up and down each day, especially the exhibitors from Cairns.

"There's also a lot of work that's generated by the simple fact that the event happens."

This year's key theme of Ag and Innovation has attracted a range of peak national bodies, to attend the Field Days, such as QFF (Queensland Farmers' Federation), NFF (National Farmers' Federation) and HIA (Horticulture Innovation Australia).

Mr Moro said having such dignitaries attend was a step in the right direction to growing the Field Days even further.

"There will be people here this year from all over Australia because we have the QFF Breakfast, and NFF forum to discuss the issues with farmers and share some interesting developments in Ag Innovation space," he

"I'd like to see this event become as big as Beef Week one day, which is held down in Toowoomba every two years. It's huge.

"I'd like to see politicians one day just come to our event to talk to the locals as permanent fixture on their calendar, rather than be invited."

Rotary FNQ Field Days Event Chair Andrew McCosh encouraged locals to come along and show their support.

"It's really important that people come and support things like this because it's a massive iob to put together," he said.

"It gives people an opportunity to come and see what's going on in the agricultural area ... some of our locals are at the forefront of innovation.

"The event also pours a lot of money economically into the community and that's felt right through Atherton, Mareeba, Cairns.

"All the motels get booked out and the various facilities in the area get used too. It really does boost the economic development in the whole area.

"Quite a number of the exhibitors offer specials during the Field Days too so it's a great way to them to make sales and get their name out there to a wide range of people."









THE mighty roar of tractors being put to the ultimate test will be heard far and wide at the Rotary FNQ Field Days.

The hugely popular Tractor Pull and Garden Tractor Display is back bigger and better than ever, and has grown to become one of the most popular attractions at the three-day event.

Sponsored by Gr8 Northern Ag and Kubota in 2025, more than 40 tractors from across Queensland had registered to battle it out for glory on Wednesday and Thursday morning and afternoon, followed by a final demonstration on Friday morning.

Each of the machines that enter the competition must meet the guidelines of being two-wheel drive and at least 40 years old.

The tractor pull involves either a 'vintage' or 'classic tractor' pulling a sled along a 120m track. Engine capacity categories range from 20 horsepower (HP) right up to more than 200 HP and additional crawler classes.

Two sleds will be in action – one to pull 20HP to 100HP tractors, and a second to pull 100HP to over 200HP – as well as a smaller sled for the kid's category.

NQ Tractor Pulling Inc president, Mark Brown said he was looking forward to this year's competition. "We've had lots of interest and there will have lots of impressive tractors in the mix this year that will put on a good show for the crowds," he said.

"We've had people interested from Mackay, Ingham, Babinda, Innisfail, Mossman, and probably 20 tractors from our locals.

"My daughter has a Zetor tractor and she's painted it pink for Breast Cancer - that will be an eye catching one. She was never going to paint one of my John Deere's pink.

"We've also got a young fella from Mount Surprise that will be competing in the junior section that's done a great job."

The competition will also feature the next generation of agricultural leaders, with a Garden Tractor Display for junior competitors as young as eight to get involved in.

Modified ride-on lawn mowers with the deck removed and garden tractors under 15HP and over 15HP, pulling a smaller sled will also line up to put their machines to the test.

The Gr8 Northern Ag Kubota Tractor Pull and Garden Tractor Display will take place on Wednesday and Thursday at 10.30am and 2.30pm. The final will be held on Thursday at 2.30pm and there will be a demonstration on Friday morning at 10.30am.



#### Labour of love on display at vintage engine exhibit



MACHINES from generations past are being dusted off and oiled up as part of this year's Vintage Static Engine exhibit.

A popular feature of the Rotary FNQ Field Days, the display features a variety of vintage working engines and other machines from generations past that have been restored.

The display complements all the action at the Tractor Pull and Garden Tractor Display.

Spectators will have the chance to get up close and personal with the vintage machines and their owners to learn about the rich history of the machines.

Display co-ordinator Ray Blain said machinery collectors from Burdekin, Townsville, Mareeba and Chillagoe had signed up to take part in what's expected to the best biggest and best exhibit to date.

He said more than 10 vintage engines would be on display, providing the ultimate showcase of old and new.

"There's so many facets about doing this hobby ... but attending the Field Days is showing people yesterday's equipment in today's environment," he said.

"You go out and collect an engine from a farm or somewhere, you listen to the stories

that the men and women folk talk about and what they had to do to work it, and then you bring it home and restore it. Then you take it to an event like the Field Days and you can see their face light up when they see it restored and running.

"It's returning memories that at times aren't all that kind to some of these people, but they do have a kind word to say to you about what you've done.

"It's the stories, it's the people, it's the feedback that you get for your labour of love."

Mr Blain said while the number of engine restorers was starting to dwindle, it was important to support local events such as the Field Days.

"I will be taking along three or four engines, Tony Little from Chillagoe will also be taking along three or four," he said.

"The guys from the Burdekin will be taking up a nice big engine and also an auto cycle, which is a motorised push bike that they ride around on. It's quite a nice exhibit.

"We've also got a couple of water pumps and hot air engine that will be on display."

The Vintage Static Engine exhibit will be located near the tractor pull area.







# Field Days powered by community volunteers

#### From paddock to pride: Graziers bring their best

GRAZIERS from far and wide will ignificant wet season for many.

The display is a key attraction of the Rotary FNQ Field Days and highlights the strength of the region's livestock industry.

The cattle display also attracts interest from industry representatives and potential buyers alike.

Brahman, Drought Master, Murray Grey, Angus and Shorthorns will be some of the cattle featured in this year's display.

Rotary FNQ Field Days Site Co-Ordinator Nina Grant said more than 30 pens had been sold - a strong rollout despite some graziers having to cancel after being impacted by an extreme wet

"The cattle area was fully booked showcase their quality stock in a display earlier in the year and then we created of true resilience and dedication after a more pens than we had in 2023 with some portable panels," she said.

"It was very crazy when we did launch – we had people on waitlists.

"But since then, we had some cancellations due to the weather. The people that were coming in from West experienced significant rain and flooding and the cattle in not in the condition that they would like, or their too busy trying to keep the farm going during the extreme weather.

"With farming, agriculture and livestock the farmers are heavily impacted by weather and we do have extreme weather across Queensland and interstate so that impacts our event at times."







#### FNQ industries at the heart of national and global supply

Far North Queensland stands out as one of Australia's most diverse and productive agricultural regions, playing a vital role in feeding the nation and supporting global markets

FROM tropical fruits and sugarcane to cattle and crops, the region's rich soils and favourable climate support a thriving industry that underpins both local livelihoods and international trade.

The region's unique geography and climate zones allow for year-round production, making it a cornerstone of Australia's agricultural economy.

Major industries across the Far North region include agriculture, horticulture, cattle and poultry, and mining.

The region is also now home to renewable energy industry and cotton.

Reflecting the region's strength in the horticulture sector, the gross value of production is sitting at \$748 million, a 42 per cent increase in five years according to the 2024 Mareeba & Atherton Tablelands Horticulture Profile.

Farmour Managing Director, Ebony Faichney carried out the 2024 report, and said there had been one key crop that had contributed to the significant growth.

"A lot of that growth can be contributed to the growing citrus industry, which is now the highest vale commodity for the Mareeba and Tablelands area," she said.

The 2024 Mareeba & Atherton Tablelands Horticulture Profile detailed that the citrus industry had increased in value by 200 per cent in the past five years, due to maturation of high yielding lemon and mandarin plantings with strong market

"We've also seen strong prices and new plantings of banana, citrus, table grapes and papaya," Ms Faichney said.

"Avocados are still up there, but the total value of that industry has declined. Total hectares of avocados have doubled in the past five years, but market prices have halved, resulting in a net decrease of

"The impacts of Cyclone Jasper and the summer that we had following, is well and truly still being felt by growers ... the long-term financial burden of an absolute awful season is going to be felt for some

"Most of our tree crops you've got one shot at harvest and unfortunately no one made any money that year."

Ms Faichney said horticulture growers were currently facing struggles around compliance burden and profitability

"The Red Tape and hoops that they have to jump through are getting harder and faster unfortunately, which is causing all of our issues at the moment for growers," she said.

"Also cost of production is going up, cost of labour is going up, but returns to growers are going down.

"Although the value of production of horticulture in the region continues to grow, that figure does not represent grower profitability, and most commodities have experienced a farm gate gross value production growth, but cost of production has increased significantly more.

"It's a bit of an uncertain time at the moment, but the diversity of the Mareeba and Atherton Tablelands is a real feather in our cap and something that we can lean on. That's why many growers grow multiple crops."

While the 2025 outlook remained somewhat uncertain, Ms Faichney said a lot of work was being done behind the scenes around compliance burden through peak industry bodies and Government.

"We're hopeful that we're going to see some positive changes for growers in the next 12 months, but it's a huge mountain to climb," she said.

Beyond crops, FNQ also supports thriving livestock and aquaculture industries, reinforcing its status as a powerhouse of rural productivity and innova-

The sessions will offer valuable insights into emerging trends and innovations shaping the future of agriculture all focused around the event's key theme for 2025 - Agriculture and Innovation.

#### A community passion project

THE conception of Northern Australia's largest field days is a tale of community passion.

In the mid-1980s, one of Atherton's pioneering farming families, the Beattie's offered land on their Malanda-Atherton Road potato farm for a Field Day.

Then in September 1989, the Rotary Clubs of Atherton, Malanda, Mareeba and Kuranda combined their shared vision to host an event that would directly benefit their communities.

From this, the Rotary FNQ Field days was born.

Held over three days on a biennial basis, the event quickly became an award-winning Field Days and was the largest community event on the Tablelands.

On average 8,000 people attended each day and a record number of funds were raised each year, prompting the event to move locations four times.

The Atherton and Mareeba Rotary Clubs have now combined to operate the event, and each club has its priority projects and causes.

The Field Days committee also donates to service clubs across the Tableland region.

Following the 2011 event it was clear that a new, bigger and better site was needed to help the event grow to its full potential.

In May 2013, the Mareeba Rodeo Grounds was transformed into the largest and most comprehensive display of agricultural equipment, associated products, and services in the region. It hosted 250 exhibitors and "was deemed a sell-out".

Then in 2019, a record number of sites were released for sale. But it was 2021 when even higher records were broken, with 15,000 people attending the three-day event and a record 500 exhibitors featured.

The growth would not be possible without the support from exhibitors, some of which have returned each event since the beginning and the public in the gates.



#### **SKYBURY FARMS-PICKING & PACKING**

Skybury Farm is located at Paddy's Green just outside Mareeba, at the northern end of the fertile Atherton Tablelands. Skybury Plantation covers 470 acres (190) and sits about 1706 feet (520 metres) above sea level. Coffee and red papaya is grown at

SkyburyTropical Plantation. The sandy soils and subtropical climate provide the perfect growing conditions for coffee and papaya. Skybury produces about 40 tonnes of green coffee per year and over two million kilos of red papaya. At peak times, the packing shed will process over 60 pallets of papaya per day - that's about 60 tonnes. Skybury employs about 90 people in its papaya, coffee and tourism operations.



#### PADDY'S GREEN LEMON MYRTLE -**PROCESSING PLANT**

Our Lemon Myrtle Is Grown at Paddys Green which is just outside Mareeba in Far North Queensland, where we have 300 sunny days a year - an attraction for Grey Nomads from all over the country. Whilst we cool down slightly in the winter we traditionally have a wet and dry season, which is perfect for the production of lemon

myrtleThe lemon myrtle trees have been growing for about 2.5 years and are now ready to harvest the new shoots. Harvesting the leaves and young stems is a carefully designed process to create the high quality products we see today.



#### PINATA FARMING - PINEAPPLE PLANTING

When we planted our first pineapples in the Mareeba district of tropical north Queensland in 1994, we were entering uncharted territory for pineapple production. Piñata pineapples are grown on four adjoining Piñata Farms-owned properties spread over 150 hectares of gentle slopes at Paddy's Green, at the northern end of the Atherton Tablelands. Mareeba's sandy soil and nine-month

dry spell is ideal for summer pineapple production. Our northern operation produces some 200,000 trays between October and March. We produce two pineapple varieties here - MD2s and 73-50s. It takes 18 months to produce a crop, six months less than Wamuran. We have modified traditional growing practices to suit the region, implementing measures such as erosion control, underground drainage and irrigation.

# New technology makes biosecurity responses easier for fruit growers

A NEW \$1.7 million mapping initiative is expected to change how fruit growers will soon respond to biosecurity threats. By drawing on a range of inputs including industry data, citizen science, remote sensing and ground truthing this technology will see the development of industry specific mapping databases that will directly help protect Australian fruit from pests and disease.

The aim of mapping the location data is to safeguard the industries by allowing first responders and authorities to quickly plan protection zones during pest and disease incursions.

Delivered by Hort Innovation and led by the University of New England's Applied Agricultural Remote Sensing Centre (AARSC) in partnership with Future Food Systems CRC, the new tool marks an expansion of the Australian Tree Crop Map – a map which services a number of tree crop industries – including avocados, bananas, mangoes, citrus, and now lychees - and also boasts market access, traceability, yield forecasting, carbon storage, regeneration, and tropical weather and drought resilience applications.

Hort Innovation CEO Brett Fifield emphasised the critical role of the map in supporting biosecurity preparedness and response. "The Australian Tree Crop Map has repeatedly proven its worth, particularly in the face of biosecurity challenges like the Varroa Mite incursion."

"With its ability to quickly pinpoint areas of concern, the map is an essential tool in managing biosecurity risks and equipping the industry with the timely data needed for an effective response."

University of New England senior researcher Craig Shephard said the map is becoming a cornerstone for biosecurity monitoring.

"The Australian Tree Crop Map, created to Australian mapping standards and freely available for industry use, is rapidly advancing as a benchmark for industry-wide spatial data adoption. This data is critical for underpinning early biosecurity detection, risk assessment, and response coordination."

Australian Lychee Growers' Association executive officer Jill Houser said the map will enhance biosecurity planning for lychee growers.

"Access to this comprehensive mapping resource will give lychee growers invaluable insights to better respond to biosecurity risks and other industry challenges. The data on crop trends and regional variations will help us make informed decisions, ensuring



that we can protect our industry from both biosecurity threats and market shifts."

Industries tracked by the Australian Tree Crop Map, are now using the data to create industry specific dashboards to enable data driven decisions into the future. Growers are encouraged to reach out to their peak industry body to access these dashboards or 'spatial

Queensland's Wet Tropics is expected to be published in early May, including the intensive growing regions in (Mareeba, Dimbulah, Atherton, Innisfail, Tully) and the Burdekin (Ayr, Bowen, Proserpine).
